

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

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# LETTER FROM EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

#### DEAR CENTER FOR SUCCESS COMMUNITY,

Inside the realm of the global pandemic that gripped the world in 2020, Center for Success Network worked hard to navigate the changes that were happening in our communities. While we continued using traditional methods of supporting our students' literacy skills, we adopted new strategies that address discoveries that we've made beneath the angst of life amid the COVID-19 pandemic, including the development of enhanced interactive virtual learning content, vital parent engagement events, cooperative meeting spaces, and additional collaborative partnerships with local non-profit, education, business and arts and culture sectors.

Center for Success Network expanded services with new partnerships at the Brilliant Detroit Fitzgerald site, Downtown Boxing Gym and Urban Neighborhood Initiatives. Center for Success Network also partnered with E-Community Outreach Services in Pontiac to launch a free parenting workshop that brought 10 to 15 parents into the program every week. The 10-week program taught parents about literacy, advocacy for their children in education, self-care, and career development.

Several new funders supported this growth, including United Way for Southeastern Michigan, Kirk in the Hills, Community Foundation for Southeast Michigan, and the Oakland University Community Impact Sponsorship. The Center remains committed to ensure that the specific needs and desires of students and their families are heard and accurately addressed. While it was a challenging year, we continue our dedication to our mission to unite community and literacy to empower students in their journey of education.



# **Program Data**

#### \*\*\* Fountas and Pinnell Running Records (F/P Data)

This assessment helps to determine a student's independent and instructional reading levels. The assessment is given in a one-on-one situation which also allows assessors to observe student reading behaviors, engage in comprehension conversations that go beyond retelling, and make informed decisions that connect the results of the assessment to the instruction we are developing for each student. The student's independent reading level is then used to help choose materials from the classroom library for the student to use during the mentor sessions.



#### \*\*\* DIBELS

The Dynamic Indicators of Basic Early Literacy Skills (DIBELS) are a set of procedures and measures for assessing the acquisition of early literacy skills from kindergarten through sixth grade. They are designed to be short (one minute) fluency measures used to regularly monitor the development of early literacy and early reading skills.


